## Q: What Happens At The Chicken farm?



What does the process at a chicken farm starts with?

# Chicks like the ones we hatched will go to the farm at 18 weeks.





# Hens will start to lay eggs at 20-22 weeks old.

## The eggs will go on a accumulator. The accumulator will split the eggs into groups.





# Next the eggs will go through the Orientation process, this is where the eggs are placed in the same direction.









## Next the eggs are washed and sanitized



### Now they will go through the candling process. This is when the egg are inspected for internal imperfections.









Eggs are also inspected for microcracks, microcracks are not easily seen. Crack detectors chech the eggs sonically, tiny probes tap the egg and listen for the sound it makes.



# The eggs are now put into cartons and sorted by size. Then shipped to stores
